Rugby Ontario is actively searching for a talented and ambitious individual who is passionate about the field of sport management, wants to apply their knowledge and experience, and support a vision of **Rugby for All**.

Rugby Ontario in partnership with Rugby Canada through the CSAI Sport Canada Funding are seeking Sport for All Sessional Coaches to work directly with three or more schools tied to one focus rugby club, to build a local Rugby Hub. The position will develop and foster relationships to support youth to transition from trying rugby in schools to playing rugby in a festival format, leading to staying in rugby at local clubs.

At this time, Rugby Ontario is seeking 4 positions – one for each of the following focus clubs: Ottawa Ospreys, Aurora Barbarians, Toronto Nomads, and Windsor Rogues.

What you'll be doing

Reporting to the Rugby Ontario, Rugby Development Manager, and the Rugby Canada, Coaching in Schools Project Coordinator, the Sport for All Sessional Coach will be responsible for introducing, creating engagement, and delivering rugby in local schools in collaboration with a local rugby club. The post will culminate in a school festival for your grouping of schools in advance of the 2024 minor rugby season. The purpose of these positions is to provide quality coaching sessions in elementary schools using the Rookie Rugby program, deliver try rugby days for youth, and support the advancement of club rugby while building towards a sustainable legacy. Success in this role will rely on the development of close working relationships with stakeholders at Rugby Ontario, Rugby Canada, the local rugby club, and the schools. This coupled with excellent organizational and communication skills, and the ability to create quality sport experiences will be essential to the successful achievement of this position's objectives.



Primary Duties & Responsibilities

- Organize, plan, and deliver quality coaching sessions in 3 or more elementary schools.
- Plan and deliver a school festival for elementary school students.
- Deliver a club rugby Try Rugby Day in advance of the 2024 Minor Rugby Season.
- Build and maintain relationships with stakeholders both internal and external.
- Communicate clearly and effectively with all relevant stakeholders.
- Complete and submit bi-weekly and final reports in a timely manner.
- Assist with the creation and implementation of programs and resources to support the development of the local club.
- Additional duties as required.



Desired Experience & Qualifications

- Available to commit to a minimum of three days of school delivery for 6-12 weeks (one day of delivery is at least three hours, during school hours).
- Available to commit 12 hours a week for 6-12 weeks to club development initiatives through the project.
- Experience in coaching, especially in the sport of rugby, is considered an asset.
- Knowledge of the sport of rugby and of sport organizations an asset.
- Knowledge of the local grassroots sport community, especially the rugby community is an asset.
- Experience with sport and youth development an asset.
- Demonstrated evidence of an ability to work independently without supervision but in accordance with documented policy and procedure guidelines.
- Displays excellent time management and workplace co-operation skills.
- Strong leadership, organizational, and communication skills.
- Exceptional planning, analytical and reporting skills.
- Ability to work within a flexible schedule and in a remote work environment setting.
- Demonstrated strong values and ethics, in accordance with Rugby Ontario and Rugby Canada's organizational values (and other policies), through personal and professional behaviours.
- Must be legally eligible to work in Canada.
- Current, clear criminal record check for the vulnerable sector required.
- Valid Driver's License and the ability / willingness to travel.
